Documents must be original. If published elsewhere, notify us so that we may procure publication rights. Please write your name on the article as well as a short biography of no more than 500 words. There are no more requirements for the actual form.

We do not cater to a level of education, SES, or any other irrelevant demographic. Your paper will be judged purely upon the depth at which it pursues its subject and the perceivable interest of our subscribers. We welcome submissions from all walks of people, and we review them on a rolling-basis.

We edit and re-format essays independent of approval from the writer. We do promise that publication of the article will include the artist's name and articles' full-length in the fully paid issue. Articles may be truncated in the free issue, but name will always be included. We can accept previously unpublished work with appropriate approval of the publisher.
